

Perambulations of the Winchester and Barkhamsted Town Line

1885: May 9th

Have this day run and perambulated the line between Winchester and Barkhamsted. Beginning at the south end at a great heap of stones marked $\frac{W. | B.}{T. | N.H.}$.

1. Thence N. 22° E. 20 chains, 12 links to an old monument on flat land in the woods 5½ rods north of small brook, marked 1 besides the common letters.
2. Thence N. 21°30' E. 20 chains, 54 links to an old monument by the fence, marked 2.
3. Thence N. 21° E. 20 chains, 5 links to an old monument in land descending north near Ironwood tree and 7 rods north of small stream, marked 3.
4. Thence N. 21° E. 19 chains, 36 links to a new monument in the woods on south side of small stream 1 rod east, marked 4.
5. Thence N. 22°30' E. 20 chains, 50 links to an old monument in the fence 2 chains, 54 links north of brook, marked 5.
6. Thence N. 21°15' E. 20 chains, 34 links to an old monument 84 links south of a brook by a Poplar tree, marked 6.
7. Thence N. 22° E. 20 chains to an old monument on both sides of trail by an Apple tree stump 10 chains north of Greenwoods Turnpike, marked 7.
8. Thence N. 21° E. 20 chains, 27 links to an old monument on south side of Wallins Hill one rod south of south end of wall, marked 8.
9. Thence N. 20°30' E. 20 chains to an old monument on top of Wallins Hill about 10 rods north of an old cellar in the meadow, marked 9.
10. Thence N. 21°30' E. 20 chains, 4 links to a large rock in the wall east of Sylvester Tosant's orchard, marked WB. 10.
11. Thence N. 21°45' E. 20 chains to an old monument on both sides of wall on west side of an orchard, marked 11.

12. Thence N. 21° E. 20 chains to an old monument in wet land, marked 12.
13. Thence N. 21° E. 23 chains, 36 links to an old monument at northeast corner of a rock on the east side of highway by woods, marked 13.
14. Thence N. 20° E. 22 chains, 65 links to an old monument on a smooth rock 10 links west of middle of traveled road, marked 14.
15. Thence N. 21°45' E. 20 chains to an old monument in the west line of road north of school house, marked 15
16. Thence N. 21°45' E. 17 chains, 65 links to an old monument on on a rock west of the west side of road about 4 rods south of brook.
17. Thence N. 21°45' E. 20 chains to a new monument on east side of wall in west line of road north of Henry Cleveland's house, marked 17.
18. Thence N. 21°45' E. 20 chains to a new monument 6 feet east of wall in west line of road on flat land.
19. Thence N. 21°45' E. 17 chains to an old monument west of the road about 3 rods north of a swamp, marked 19
20. Thence N. 21°45' E. 20 chains, 46 links to an old monument in the fence, marked 20.
21. Thence N. 21°30' E. 20 chains, 8 links to an old monument in the meadow about 2 rods south of the south end of wall, marked 21.
22. Thence N. 21°30' E. 20 chains, 12 links to the corner of Winchester and Barkhamsted. It is a heap of stones on a great rock at north end of a hill marked WCB.

The distances are all taken surface measure and the monuments are large heaps of stones marked WB. besides the number. Marking stones are also placed where the line crosses the road.

1900: April 26th

I have this day perambulated the line between Winchester and Barkhamsted and renewed the bounds and monuments there on.

Beginning at the corner of Winchester, Torrington, Barkhamsted, and New Hartford at a heap of stones one of which is marked $\frac{W.}{T.}|\frac{B.}{N.H.}$, the lower side of the stone being marked J.L. F.G.

1. Thence N. 20° E. 20 chains, 12 links to an old monument on flat land in the woods (5½ rods north of small brook) marked W.B. 1.
2. Thence N. 20° E. 20 chains, 54 links to an old monument by the fence marked W.B. 2.
3. Thence N. 19° E. 20 chains, 5 links to an old monument on land descending north (near a blazed non-wood tree and 7 rods north of small stream) marked W.B. 3.
4. Thence N. 19° E. 17 chains to a new monument about 2 rods south of a small brook, marked W|B 4.
5. Thence N. 20°30' E. 20 chains, 80 links to an old monument in the fence 2 chains, 54 links north of brook, marked W|B 5.
6. Thence N. 19°15' E. 20 chains, 34 links to an old monument 84 links south of a brook, marked W|B 6.
7. Thence N. 20° E. 20 chains to an old monument on both sides of wall 10 chains north of Greenwoods Turnpike, marked W|B 7.
8. Thence N. 19° E. 20 chains, 27 links to an old monument on south side of Wallins Hill one rod south of south end of wall marked WB 8.
9. Thence N. 18°30' E. 20 chains to an old monument on top of Wallins Hill about 10 rods north of an old cellar in the meadow marked W|B 9.
10. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 4 links to a large rock in the wall east of an orchard marked W|B 10.
11. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to an old monument on both side of wall on west side of an orchard marked W|B 11.
12. Thence N. 19° E. 20 chains to a new monument in wet land, not marked.
13. Thence N. 19° E. 23 chains, 36 links to an old monument at northeast corner of a rock on the east side of highway by woods marked W|B 13.
14. Thence N. 20° E. 22 chains, 64 links to an old monument on a smooth rock 10 links west of middle of traveled road marked W|B 14.

15. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to an old monument on west line of road north of school house, marked W|B 15.
16. Thence N. 19°45' E. 17 chains, 65 links to an old monument on a rock west of the west side of road about 4 rods south of brook marked W|B 16.
17. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to a new monument on east side of wall in west line of road north of Henry Cleveland's house marked W|B 17.
18. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to a new monument but east of wall in west line of road on flat land marked W|B 18.
19. Thence N. 19°45' E. 17 chains, 90 links to an old monument west of the road about 3 rods north of a swamp marked W|B 19.
20. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains, 46 links to an old monument in the fence marked W|B 20.
21. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 8 links to an old monument in the meadow about 2 rods south of the south end of wall marked W|B 21.
22. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 12 links to the corner of Winchester and Barkhamsted in Colebrook line. It is a great rock at north end of a hill marked W.C.B. in deep letters.

All the distances are taken surface measure and the courses are the same as given in the record of 1866. When courses were taken to find the old monuments or restore them allowance was made for the westerly variation of the needle since 1866.

The monuments are normally long heaps of stones with one marked stone on top. There are also marked stones where the line crosses roads.

1921: December 1st

On December 1, 1921, I perambulated the line between the Town of Winchester and Barkhamsted and hereby submit my report as follows:

The last preceding perambulation was made in April 1910 and is recorded in the Land Records of the Town of Winchester. The record of said perambulation and description of each bound and monument are substantially quoted herein.

1. Beginning at the southeast corner of the Town of Winchester it being also a corner of Barkhamsted, Torrington, and New Hartford at a heap of stones marked $\frac{W.}{T.} | \frac{B.}{N.H.}$. The lower side of the stone being marked J.L.F.C. This monument was found in good condition.
2. Thence N. 20° E. 20 chains, 12 links to an old monument on flat land in the woods 5½ rods north of a small brook marked W.B. (1). This monument was found in good condition.
3. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 54 links to an old monument by the fence marked W.B.(2). This monument was found in good condition.
4. Thence N. 19° E. 20 chains, 5 links to an old monument on land descending north near a blazed iron wood tree and 7 rods north of a small stream. This monument was found as described except that it was not marked.
5. Thence N. 19° E. 19 chains to a new monument about 2 rods south of a small brook marked W.B.4. This monument we found in good condition.
6. Thence N. 20°30' E. 20 chains, 80 links to an old monument in the fence 54 links north of a brook, marked W.B.5. This monument was found in good condition.
7. Thence N. 19°15' E. 20 chains, 34 links to an old monument 84 links south of brook marked W B 6. This monument we found in good condition.
8. Thence N. 20° E. 20 chains to an old monument on the wall 10 chains north of Greenwoods Turnpike, marked W B 7. This monument we found in good condition.
9. Thence N. 19° E. 20 chains, 27 links links to a monument on the south side of Wallins Hill one rod south of south end of wall, marked W B 8. This monument we found in good condition.
10. Thence N. 18°30' E. 20 chains to an old monument on the top of Wallins Hill. This monument was not found but we chiseled the letters W.B.9 on a flat rock even with the surface of the ground and piled stones thereon. This monument is in the correct position 40 links east of a wall and about 10 rods north of an old cellar, and the distances in both directions to adjacent bounds are correct.

11. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 4 links to a large rock in the wall east of an orchard marked W B 10. This monument we found in good condition.
12. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to an old monument on the wall west of an open pasture. This monument was not found but we erected another on the wall and chiseled the letters W B 11 thereon. This monument is in its correct position, on the wall and the distances north and south to the next adjacent bounds are correct.
13. Thence N. 19° E. 20 chains to a monument on wet land about 50 links southwest of a Hemlock tree. This monument we found in good condition and chiseled the letters W B (12) thereon.
14. Thence N. 19° E. 23 chains, 36 links to a monument at northeast corner of a rock on east side of highway marked W B 13. This monument is a large flat rock which we found in good condition.
15. Thence N. 20° E. 22 chains, 65 links to an old monument being a smooth rock 10 links west of middle of traveled road, marked W B 14. This monument we found in good condition.
16. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to a monument on west line of road north of school house, marked W B 15. This monument we found in good condition.
17. Thence N. 19°45' E. 17 chains, 65 links to a monument on a rock west of the road and about 4 rods south of brook. We found here a pile of stones in position as described and chiseled the letters W B 16 on a tight pointed rock with stones piled around it.
18. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to a monument on the wall in the west line of road north of Henry Cleveland's house, marked W B 17. This monument we found in good condition.
19. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains to a monument 6 feet east of wall in west line of road on flat land. This monument we found in good condition.
20. Thence N. 19°45' E. 17 chains, 90 links to a monument west of road about 3 rods north of a swamp, marked W B 19. This monument we found in good condition.
21. Thence N. 19°45' E. 20 chains, 46 links to an old monument in the fence marked W B 20. This monument we found in good condition.
22. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 81 links to an old monument in pasture about 2 rods south of south end of wall marked W B 21. This monument we found in good condition.
23. Thence N. 19°30' E. 20 chains, 12 links links to a corner of Winchester and Barkhamsted on the south line of Colebrook. It is a great road on the north end of a hill, marked W.C.B. in deep letters. This monument we found in good condition.

All distances are taken surface measure and the courses are given the same as in 1910. The monuments are usually long heaps of stones with a marked stone on top. We did not find any monuments where the line crossed highways. We rechiseled the letters in the stone in a number of cases as the old lettering had been much weather worn.
